# DIRECTOR'S NOTES

### **RUBEN ARANA**

In the poignant and humorous play, Sibling Rivalry, the loss of family members is a catalyst for sibling conflict, love, and laughter. The story unfolds through four vignettes, each capturing a distinct moment in a family's history as they navigate the complexities of grief. Set in rural south Alabama, the siblings' relationships are multifaceted, marked by both

affection and antagonism as well as refinement and crassness. Their arguments and bickering serve as a coping mechanism, a way to mask the pain and vulnerability that comes with losing loved ones. Despite their differences, the siblings' love for each other is palpable, and their humor becomes a lifeline, helping them to find moments of levity in the darkness.

Through the vignettes, the play explores the absurdities and complexities of family dynamics in the face of mortality. The siblings' interactions are both heartbreaking and hilarious, often simultaneously. Their struggles to come to terms with loss are relatable, and their humor becomes a way to honor their loved ones. The play's use of humor also highlights the resilience of family bonds, showing that even in the midst of grief, love and laughter can coexist. By embracing the complexities of family relationships, *Sibling Rivalry* creates a space for audiences to reflect on their own experiences with loss, love, and the power of humor to heal.

James Webb, a distinguished alumnus of FAMU's Essential Theatre program, brings his heartfelt stories to life. With a legacy of mentorship and artistic growth, Webb's connection to FAMU has profoundly impacted countless students over the years. # PLAYWRIGHT'S PROFILE

### **JAMES WEBB**

James Webb is a Charlotte-based playwright, director, and educator whose work centers on the Black experience. As a playwright, Webb has written *The Contract* and *Sibling Rivalry*, along with several youth theatre works, including *The House* of *Jean-René*, *STEAM*, and *Wrestling with Angels*. In 2023, he received a playwriting fellowship from the Queen City New Play Festival for his play *The Book of Layman*.

Webb recently directed Three Bone Theatre's production of ... What The End Will Be and Children's Theatre of Charlotte's Diary of a Wimpy Kid and Catching the Moon. His work has been produced at Mill Mountain Theatre (Roanoke, VA), Common Ground Theatre (San Diego, CA), Essential Theatre (Washington, D.C.), Confrontation Theatre (Portland, OR), Ensemble Theatre (Los Angeles, CA), Theatre Row (New York City, NY), and the International Black Theatre Festival (Winston-Salem, NC). He is an Assistant Professor of Theatre at Davidson College in North Carolina and spends his summers as a resident director and playwright with the Irene C. Edmonds Youth Theatre in Tallahassee. FL.
